In the interest of safeguarding and preserving Monuments and Heritage Sites in Guyana, the National Trust advises against disturbing, damaging or interfering sites by Law (National Trust Act of 1972 Chapter 20:03 (Revised 2012).) Failure to comply will result in fines and court proceedings. These sites are symbols of our national identity and must be maintained for the benefit and enjoyment of the present and future generations.

DO'S



Do capture the moment and learn more about these sites during your visit

Do use the benches provided to sit and enjoy the sites

Do leave a clean site and environment

Do ensure your actions contribute to the preservation and long term survival of our monuments

Do respect and obey all rules governing these sites



DON'TS



Do not litter or dump garbage on or near sites

Do not climb, stand or jump on the monument



Do not light fires on or near these sites

Do not remove plants or flowers from heritage sites



Do not deface by writing, painting or marking on the monument

Do not disturb or remove any part(s) of the monument
